

How did you start this?

Well, I have worked in the travel industry since the age of 18, from running information centres in a ski resort, to supervising hotel receptions in the Greek islands and managing travel agencies from London to Perth, I was a European tour guide for 3 years and I continued to teach tourism and travel at degree level as well as being a wedding celebrant and operating Bums Tums and Gums. I had my face lift when I was 56 and I am now almost 67, it was never a question of "if" I would have cosmetic surgery, it was always 'when". I did huge amount of research, found the most amazing surgeon who now teaches surgery but who recommended the surgeons I use in Pattaya. I started out taking friends for surgery during the school holidays so I could show them the ropes, this gained momentum and now I take 12 clients 4 times a year plus additional clients who travel independently.

So, what is it you actually do?

Its more about what I don't do! I often find myself taking photos of the client's areas of concern in my studio, or I ask them to email their own selfies which I send to our 6 amazing surgeons in Thailand who then evaluate the images and make recommendations on the procedures required and then give us a quote based on those photos.

I arrange the surgeries with the surgeon, organise quotes, flights, hotel and all the transport that is required to take you to/from the airport to/from the hotel and to each appointment.

I am part of your journey, from having your very first meeting with their surgeon, escorting you to all their pre-operative check-ups, waving you goodbye as you are taken to the operating theatre, and then at the end of your hospital beds the next day wiping the spittle off of your chin or holding a mango smoothie to ease the dry throat!






Do clients have to go on a group tour?

No, you can be travelling independently, and I can still organise all the flights, hotel, appointments and a car to pick you up from the airport, and I have an English-speaking international manager who looks after you when tyou get to the hospital and escorts you on your pre- op checks at the hospital.

So, what is a pre-operative check-up?

The surgeons will never do a procedure on a client without firstly having the person checked from head to toe, this includes blood tests, heart monitoring, HIV testing, and then a finally, a checkup by their medical practitioner. This takes about 2.5 hours as nothing is ever left to chance.





So how big is this hospital?

Its HUGE, there is 18 floors in just in one of the two buildings which incorporates one entire floor of dental surgeon, and the rest are heart specialists, optical, oncology, orthopedics and various others, the other 15 floors are all wards your get your own room complete with ensuite bathrooms, microwave, tea and coffee making facilities plus 3 meals per day delivered to your room. There are 7 restaurants/cafes including a juice bar and a Starbucks, a gift shop, and even a market on the weekends.

What is the most popular surgery?

Most of my clients are 50+ so it's a time when everything tends to start heading south! We have had our babies leaving us with droopy boobs (or is that just me!), we have gained and lost weight numerous times during our lives, our faces have been grilled in the hot summer sun and our neck are starting to look like turkey wattles.....so the most popular are face/neck/ upper and lower eyes \$12500,tummy tuck from \$14,000 and breast lifts at \$11500 (all a half of the price of NZ)

The price of having surgery abroad is often much cheaper than it would be to have the same procedure in New Zealand.

Since there are more regulations around cosmetic surgery and its effects here at home, most cosmetic surgery procedures are elective, meaning that they cannot be easily obtained on ACC. People who are looking to make aesthetic amendments will need to turn to private treatment, which can often be costly here in the NZ.

However, it's noted that going to Thailand can drop the costs of a procedure by 40-50%, and Mexico a gastric sleeve is only \$8K compared to \$25K here. These results have been generated by the International Society of Aesthetic Plastic Surgery (ISAPS).

Have you ever had anything go wrong?

I had one lady discover at her pre op that she had a dangerously high blood pressure (which she had never had checked) and they sent her to cardiac doctor to rectify before they would even consider surgery, one lady had heart issues in NZ over many years, in Thailand she had a relapse, the hospital monitored her and did lots of tests and sent her home to NZ with evidence of dodgy heart, when she got back to NZ the hospital whipped her in, gave her a pacemaker and told her that "going to Thailand saved your life".


We had one lady who had a large amount of skin taken off the inside leg but was warned that the water retention may well come back, this happened and the surgeon out of the kindness of his heart redid the operation for free 8 months later but still the fluid retention returned.

What if there are complications?

Things can go wrong, even at respected New Zealand hospitals.

Sorry Surgery wise......I have no horror stories, other than younger women having a breast augmentation and then wishing they had gone bigger! the good thing to mention though is that each surgeon guarantees his work for one year, based on if they have made the error, if for example

you just were not happy with say the length of your nose, or the size of your new breasts this would not be covered for free.





What is the difference between and cosmetic surgeon and a plastic surgeon?




All our surgeon are plastic surgeon. The difference lies in minimum qualifications and minimum standards
Only a plastic surgeon will call themselves a plastic surgeon.

All Plastic Surgeons are Cosmetic Surgeons BUT not all Cosmetic Surgeons are Plastic Surgeons.

Cosmetic surgery is a subspecialty of Plastic Surgery, it is part of Plastic Surgery and evolved from Plastic Surgery after the wars.

Plastic Surgery is about principles and techniques and when a Plastic Surgeon can reconstruct a face or breast and undertake advanced skills like microsurgery, performing cosmetic surgery is part of this skill set. Also, if something was to go wrong with cosmetic surgery a plastic surgeon is more than capable of rectifying the problem with cosmetic reconstructive principles. Only a plastic surgeon is trained this way and the proof lies in the many salvage and recovery operations plastic surgeons perform.







Although the role of beauty in the modern world can be debated, and there are some people against using plastic surgery, there are still reasons why manually changing the appearance granted by nature is acceptable.

There are cheek implants, chin implants, thigh lifts, arm lifts, and even a male breast reduction.




My face lift recovery

Facelift surgery, is a procedure used to reduce the appearance of facial wrinkles and other telltale signs of aging, with the goal of improving the overall appearance of the face and jaw.


Facelift surgery can help to reverse the harmful effects of time, stress, and exposure to the elements.

To perform this procedure, a facial plastic surgeon will lift and tighten the underlying muscles of the face to create more aesthetically pleasing contours appearance and rejuvenate the facial structure. Then he or she will remove excess pockets of fat and skin that can contribute to an aged, tired appearance.



Skin Elasticity

A good facelift candidate will have skin that retains some of its natural suppleness and flexibility. This is important because, during the procedure, the surgeon tightens the facial skin to reduce the appearance of wrinkles. Successful healing with optimal results depends on having skin that is able to conform to its new, improved contours.



How do I know if I need a facelift?

When your daily regimen of creams and serums, or even nonsurgical treatment options, don't seem to make a difference anymore, it may be time to consider a facelift procedure. If you have sagging skin that easily pulls away from the face and neck or hangs loosely, a facelift is the only treatment option that can help. The facelift procedure removes this extra skin, creating a firm, youthful appearance.

Recovery -restaurant ready in 14 days!

After a facelfit you will often have a nasty headache for 6-12 hours, your bandages around your head will feel very tight (because your face is swollen beneath them), your will feel pressure under the chin and on your scalp where the bandages are tight. The bandage

probably will be removed on the day after surgery. You will have stitches or staples in your cut (incision). Your doctor will take these out in the first week. Most ladies will be recommended to wear the face compression garment.

You may have a drain in place to remove excess blood and fluid from your face and neck, this will be removed usually on day two


Remember, your face likely will be bruised and swollen. The swelling may get worse before it gets better, but it will probably go away in 6-10 days. After a few days you may get some bruises on your neck and chest. This is caused by gravity, which pulls the excess blood and bruising downward. You will feel some pain for 2 to 4 days after surgery. You may have some trouble opening your mouth for several days. The skin around the incision probably will be numb. You may have some itching or shooting pain as the feeling returns, though it may take several months for the numbness to go away.

Eye lid surgery: eyes will feel dry, you may suffer some blurred vision (especially the first few days after the operation). You may also experience some irritation under the strips they put on your eyes for the first week

Procedure - Rhinoplasty



What is a rhinoplasty?

Rhinoplasty, commonly known as a nose job, is surgery to reshape your nose.

Being a central feature of your face, your nose influences your overall facial appearance and nose re-shaping and re-sizing is commonly performed for cosmetic reasons. It is also carried out for medical reasons such as a nose injury or breathing problems.

Often patients feel the size of their nose is disproportioned with their facial features. Nose surgery can modify the size, shape and overall appearance of your nose.

Your surgeon can make your nose smaller known as a reduction rhinoplasty, or larger by augmentation rhinoplasty. The size of your nose can be changed from your tip to your bridge including your nostrils. The angle between your nose and top lip can also be altered.



What does a rhinoplasty involve?

Rhinoplasty is usually carried out under general anesthetic and takes between an hour and a

Research ties plastic surgery to higher self-esteem, better mood

Research published in Clinical Psychological Science reports that plastic surgery patients could experience more joy in life, a higher sense of satisfaction and greater self-esteem.

When comparing the results of the psychological tests of the surgical patients to those who had not had plastic surgery, people who went under the knife had higher self-esteem, experienced less anxiety and felt healthier overall. Additionally, those who opted for the procedure reported that they were happier with their bodies as a whole, not just the area on which they had work done.

A rhinoplasty involves either making one cut across the skin between your nostrils (open rhinoplasty), or tiny cuts inside your nostrils (closed rhinoplasty). A closed rhinoplasty will leave no visible scars and causes less swelling.

During reduction rhinoplasty surgery your surgeon may treat these areas of your nose to create your desired look:



- Bridge (or dorsum) your surgeon will remove the bone and cartilage causing your hump. They may break your nose to move the remaining pieces of bone closer together and to create a narrower nose.
- Tip your surgeon will remove or reshape the cartilage that makes up your tipsupport through your nostril, or by making a small cut in the area between your nostrils (known s the columella) in an open rhinoplasty.
- Length your surgeon will reduce your central nose structure called the septum
 to reduce the tip and overall length of your nose. Your tip cartilages may also be
 adjusted.
- Width your surgeon will break and reposition your side nasal bone to achieve a narrower appearance.

During augmentation rhinoplasty your surgeon may:

- Increase the bridge or tip of your nose the contou
- r of a flat bridge or tip can be changed using bone, cartilage or an implant. Bone
 or cartilage can be taken from your nasal bone or septum, or from other places
 such as your rib, hip or ear.
- Change your septum (septorhinoplasty) to straighten or improve the
 appearance of your nose after a nose injury or if you have breathing
 difficulties. Your septum can be altered as part of your rhinoplasty or as a
 separate operation.

The skin over your nose will shrink or expand to its new shape.

Rhinoplasty recovery and aftercare

You can expect to stay in hospital for one to two nights afterwards.

Your nostrils will be dressed and a protective splint held over your nose with tapeto help it reset in the correct position. The splint will be removed after seven to ten days.

Initially you may have some pain and painkillers should control this.

You may also have some dificulty breathing completely from your nose. A nasal spray or drops may help. After three weeks you should be able to blow your nose and your breathing will clear.

Your sense of smell may be affected but will normally settle down after a few weeks.

You may have bruising where your nasal bone has been restructured but this should settle in a week to ten days.

Nasal bones take three months to heal and during this time you need to take extra care not to injure it.

When the splint is removed you will be able to see the major changes but your nose may still be swollen. Swelling will improve over time and the changes to your nose will become more apparent.


Breast Augmentation


Breast augmentation increases the size of the natural breast and is frequently sought by women who are unhappy with the size of their breasts. The breasts may be of unequal size, may have minimal development, or may have decreased in size after breast-feeding or weight loss. Breast augmentation is quite successful at making the breasts larger and fuller, and often helps women to feel less self-conscious about their breast size.



Procedure

Breast augmentation consists of making a small incision, creating a pocket in the chest/breast area, and placing an implant into this pocket. The incisions are closed, and dressings are applied to the incisions, and antibiotics are typically given before and after the operation to minimise the risk of infection. The incision can be made below the breast, around the areola (the dark area surrounding the nipple) or at the armpit. Each method has advantages and disadvantages and your surgeon will discuss these prior to surgery.






Recovery

Following your surgery, you should avoid getting the dressing wet and try to keep arm extension minimal for 3-5 days. You will be able to resume light activities within 7-10 days, however, more strenuous activity should be avoided for 3-4 weeks. A supportive bra should be worn for two to three weeks, and your surgeon will change the dressings after three days and then remove the sutures after a week.

A Breast Lift Without Implants

A breast lift is one of the most popular cosmetic surgery procedures. During a breast lift, your surgeon removes excess skin and lifts the nipple and areola to a higher position on the breast.

The result? Beautiful breasts that are shapely and perky.

Undergoing breast lift surgery without the placement of implants will typically leave patients with a little less upper pole fullness in the breasts, but the results often look a bit more natural. If you have significant hollowing of the breasts, or if you desire larger breasts with more cleavage, implants will give you better results than a lift alone.



DURING YOUR CONSULTATION

The surgeon will take photos of your breasts, measure them, and talk with you about how much breast tissue will need to be removed to achieve your goal.

During your consultation, your surgeon will ask about your habits, including whether or not you smoke and what medications you take. You may have to quit smoking for a period before and after surgery to ensure proper healing. You also will have to stop taking certain medications, such as aspirin or other anti-inflammatory drugs such as Nurofen or vitamin E, or fish oil. .

How Breast Reduction Surgery Is Done

Depending on your personal situation, breast reduction surgery can be done in an outpatient facility, or you may have to stay at least one night in the hospital. In either case, you will get general anesthesia, which means you will be put to "sleep" during the procedure.

Breast reduction surgery will take about two to five hours, sometimes longer. Your surgeon will make a cut around your nipple then downward on the breast in the form of a keyhole. The operating team will remove extra skin, tissue, and fat from your breasts and reposition your nipple. Your surgeon will use drainage tubes and then stitch up your breasts and wrap them in a special gauze. You may also need to wear a surgical bra.






After breast reduction surgery, you should expect to feel tired and to have breast pain. This is normal. Your surgeon will give you an oral painkiller to ease you through the first few days after surgery. You should also avoid heavy lifting. So easy on the shopping. Some people have an emotional reaction, such as feeling depressed, after the surgery. That can be normal, and your stitches will be removed after 7-9 days.

Breast Reduction Surgery Complications and Side Effects

Scars are a normal side effect of breast reduction surgery. These scars will fade over time but will never completely disappear. Scars can be made worse if you lift heavy objects too soon after surgery.





Procedure-Tummy Tuck





Who is a candidate for a Tummy Tuck?

Have you lost weight and now struggle with excess skin? Are unhappy with the results you've achieved with diet and exercise following your pregnancy? If you answered yes to either of these questions, you could be a strong candidate for a tummy tuck. Technically known as abdominoplasty, a tummy tuck is a common cosmetic operation that helps to flatten and tighten the abdomen by removing excess fat and skin. Tightening the abdominal muscles may also help give the stomach a flatter, leaner appearance.

Can tummy tuck be combined with liposuction of the tummy?

Yes. A variation in tummy tuck technique allows tummy liposuction to be safely performed at the same time as a tummy tuck. Liposuction may be done with either a full or partial tummy tuck.

Patients often ask when it's safe for them to travel by plane following major plastic surgery such as breast augmentation or a tummy tuck.

Although each surgeon has his or her own set of post-surgery protocols, the general guideline as to when air travel is allowed is at least 7-10 days following the procedure. Your stitches will be removed after one week. The first post-operative week is extremely crucial because this is the time when complications are most likely to arise. In fact, we encourage patients who travelled for plastic surgery to stay at least 14 days post surgery.

You will also be provided with a "fit for travel certificate" for your flight home.

Full versus partial tummy tuck? what is the difference between a full tummy tuck and a mini tummy tuck?

The two procedures address different types of abdominal looseness and bulging. A full tummy tuck corrects sagging skin and loose muscles over the entire abdomen, while a mini tummy tuck is for women whose loose skin, lax muscles, and fat deposits are concentrated below the belly button.

A mini tummy tuck may be a good option if your excess skin is located below the navel only, the navel does not require reshaping or repositioning, and there is little to no muscle separation requiring repair. 1

Mini tummy tuck patients are often hoping to address a very small tummy "pouch" or revise a previous caesarean scar. The ideal mini tummy tuck patient has good upper abdominal skin and muscle tone, is slender, fit and at their ideal body weight.

There are many variations to a tummy tuck but they can all be placed into one of two categories. Both operations are invasive, but the full tummy tuck will likely lead to more

scarring and a longer recovery period.

A full tummy tuck is needed when there is a lot of stretched skin above the belly button. The incision is made low on the abdomen and runs from one hipbone to the other or longer. The skin, tissue and muscle will be moved and manipulated; the belly button will be detached; and a new, re positioned navel will be created.



Finding a way

A belt like tummy tuck takes the skin removal much farther, extending it all the way around the back. It goes all the way around (just like a belt does). Often if you have a history of weight loss the surgeon may recommended the belt tummy tuck. It is, however, a bigger procedure, with a scar that goes all the way around your waist. You can also expect that the procedure will take about 2 hours longer and also cost more.


Recovery

Following the tummy tuck procedure, you should be in a flexed position to minimise tension on the incision sites by to bending at the hips (waist) in order to reduce tension on the newly tightened skin. You will be chillaxing in your hotel bed once out of hospital, and this is perfect for this purpose but a pillow beneath your knees and several at the head of the bed will make

you comfortable. Immediately after surgery, within the first few hours, the nurses get you out of bed and you will walk in a slightly bent-over position. Start walking flexed at the waist (in a stooped position) for a few minutes every 1-2 hours the evening of surgery and continuing daily except when sleeping. This will minimize your risk for blood clots.

- In about one week you can gradually stand up straight and you will be out shopping
- Gradually increase activity as tolerated.
- No sexual activity for 6 weeks after surgery.
- Wiggle your toes and move your ankles in circles in bed every hour.
- No heavy exercise, bending, lifting, baths, swimming, sun exposure, smoking, alcohol
 or sports for 6 weeks following surgery

Procedure - Arm Lift



Thinking of an arm lift?

Maybe you're fit and healthy, but your skin is not as elastic as it once was. Or you've had good results from dieting or bariatric surgery. Either way, you're seeing one result that's not so good — flaps of loose skin hanging from your upper arms.

Some people consider getting an arm lift to minimize this irritating condition, sometimes called "bat wings." Here's what you need to know.



How does an arm lift help?

Weight watchers aren't the only ones who have this problem. As you age, your skin may get crepey and loose, creating excess bags under the arms. But most people who have a significant weight loss or weight fluctuations see this result.

Most people come to me with skin on the upper arms that has a "deflated appearance." For them, an arm lift, or what's called a brachioplasty, this can create a better contour. It gets rid of the excess, sagging skin and fat that spans from elbow to armpit.

What can you expect from the procedure?


If you choose this procedure, you'll have an arm lift in an operating room under general anesthesia.

The surgeon will remove some fat and an elliptical segment of skin from the inner back side of your arm. If there is a lot of excess skin, he or she may take some from the very top of the arm, into the armpit area.

The procedure lasts two to three hours. Afterward, you will wear a compression garment to help control swelling.

You typically can expect to resume light activity within a few days. You likely can go back to strenuous activity after three or four weeks





Why doesn't liposuction fix the problem?

If you have excess arm skin, but underlying fat keeps the skin tight, an arm lift and liposuction combination is sometimes an option. But for most patients, an arm lift, not

liposuction, is the best fix for saggy underarms.

With an arm lift, particularly if the surgeon removes a significant amount of fat and skin, there is some scarring afterward.

With an arm lift the scars are visible, surgeon try to hide it by bringing it closer to the inside of the arm, but they cannot predict how the scar will migrate.

Remember:

Liposuction alone won't treat the problem of excess skin for most people. Even if the surgeon removes underlying fat, the excess skin remains after liposuction.

What about if you have excess fat on the forearm?

To effectively remove excess skin and fat from the **forearm**, an incision extends from the **armpit to the wrist**. This is done on the ulnar (or the pinky side) of the forearm. This is the best solution for excess skin and fat of the forearms, however there will be a "z" scar around the inner elbow (see below). The forearm reduction can be done at the same time as the arm lift or brachioplasty.

Some of the surgeries will require compression garments

A compression garment is required and beneficial after tummy tucks and/or liposuction because:

- 1. It restricts the amount of edema that forms and hastens its resolution by mechanical pressure.
- 2. It decreases the amount of bruising.
- 3. It assists the loose skin in retracting or shrinking.

It is common to have weight gain due to edema, serum that collects in the area, and the tumescent fluid that was injected. This will resolve over time. The more you wear the garment initially, the quicker this fluid resolves.

Edema: a condition considered as an excess of watery fluid collecting in the tissues of the body.

The length of time that the garment should be worn varies depending on the amount of fat removed, the elastic nature of your skin, how much loose skin remains, and other factors

Your surgeon would give you the best advice, however this is the general routine for my clients

The first garment should be fitted for you prior to surgery and applied in the operating room.

Often it will become loose as the edema is mobilized, and then it will need to be replaced.

Most important advice is to listen to your surgeon, as he or she knows how much fat was removed, the elasticity that remains in your skin, and amount of skin redundancy.

I recommend that my patients wear their garments for a minimum of three weeks full time then for twelve hours at a time (day or night). If there is not a lot of redundant skin, this continues to a maximum of six weeks.

To be effective, the garment needs to fit snugly but not too tight as that can make it difficult to sleep or cause pressure problems


As the edema resolves it is common for patients to switch to a smaller garment that fits.



Recovery times

Over the past 12 years I have seen many surgeries and these are the timings that seem the most usual

As I said at our presentations, any surgery entails risk and plastic surgery is no different—except the results are often even more visible than other surgeries. Even when everything goes right, there's still some pain involved in recovery.

After a facelift you will often have a nasty headache for 6-12 hours, your bandages around your head will feel very tight (because your face is swollen beneath them), your will feel pressure under the chin and on your scalp where the bandages are tight. The bandage probably will be removed on the day after surgery. You will have stitches or staples in your cut (incision). Your doctor will take these out in the second week. Some surgeons may recommend to wear the face compression garment.

You may have a drain in place to remove excess blood and fluid from your face and neck, this will be removed usually on day two.

Remember, your face likely will be bruised and swollen. The swelling may get worse before it gets better, but it will probably go away in 6-10 days. After a few days you may get some bruises on your neck and chest. This is caused by gravity, which pulls the excess blood and bruising downward. You will feel some pain for 2 to 4 days after surgery. You may have some trouble opening your mouth for several days. The skin around the incision probably will be numb. You may have some itching or shooting pain as the feeling returns, though it may take several months for the numbness to go away.

Eye lid surgery: eyes will feel dry, you may suffer some blurred vision (especially the first few days after the operation). You may also experience some irritation under the strips they put on your eyes for the first week

Brow lift. A sense of tightness in the forehead and brow region is to be expected after surgery. There will also be some tightness and discomfort over the top and back of the scalp as this entire area has also been repositioned with the surgery.

After the surgery you will notice some bruising and swelling, especially over the upper eyelids (sometimes over the lower eyelids as well since bruising will descend downwards secondary to gravity) and bridge of the nose. Occasionally the swelling may be enough to close the eyes. This is most likely to occur about 36 to 48 hours after surgery, as the swelling usually peaks at this time.

Tummy tucks, you will be walking like a banana for the first 5-6 days, It is also important to note that swelling can last for days, weeks and even months. The duration of swelling will depend on the measures taken and the person.

Breast surgery. You'll likely feel pain and soreness around the incisions, which will be red or pink for a few months. Numbness in your nipples, areolae and breast skin might last for about six weeks. In the first few days after a breast lift, take pain medication as given to you buy the hosptial. Avoid straining, bending and lifting. Pain after breast lift surgery is normally not severe. Most often patients describe a feeling of discomfort only.

Breast augmentation: No pain, no gain! But, really, it's not too bad. Feels like you did 100 push-ups the first day, 50 push-ups the second, and 25 the third day. Usually by 4-5 days you're feeling pretty good, however the larger your implants, the more pain you will have after your surgery.

The position of your implants. Implants placed underneath the pectoral, or chest, muscles tend to hurt more post-surgery. This is because the tissue is experiencing more trauma. The less the tissues are traumatized and the less bleeding there is, the better your post-op pain level will be.

liposuction. The pain experienced during the recovery phase has also been compared to a severe muscular ache and may vary from one day to the next. After 48 hours the swelling and bruising rapidly subside. To minimize the swelling, sleep with your head elevated for 4 weeks after surgery.





The first thing I do is to quote you on the basic surgery.

Before booking your flights or accommodation, I first of all send your case study/notes up to the surgeon along with photographs that I get you to send me. Until I hear back from the surgeon as to whether you would be a likely candidate I do not book any transport or accommodation.

What is the service fee I am paying to JBTG? (Jackie-Bums Tums and Gums)

Most travel agencies charge a service fee for most bookings made. This has come into effect in the last 10 years as most airlines drastically cut or eliminated commissions paid to travel agents. The revenues had to be replaced by some means or most travel agencies would cease to exist. Most people recognise that a service fee is a small price to pay to ensure that your travel is booked safely by an experienced travel agent.

My prices reflect whether client is going independently or with a group tour my fee is inbuilt and this covers my negotiations with the surgeons, the bookings of flights and accommodation and the general "go between" involving yourself and the hospital staff.

Is my restorative surgery covered in my travel insurance?

No, in New Zealand, elective surgery is not covered. However I am working with a USA insurance company who will cover medical tourism.

Do I have to share a room with someone else on a tour?

Prices are per person based on 2 people sharing, and I endeavour to match you up with another person from the group. However accommodation is easy on the pocket in Thailand and you pay very little more (approx \$500) for your own room, which I highly recommend as you sometimes just want to be alone after surgery.

What do I need to tell you to pass on to the hospital?

I need photos of the area where you want surgery, I need photos front on, side and at 45% angle, no jewelry and not need to show your head (unless of course its for surgery from neck up!) NO selfies, and no mirror images, as the surgeon need to be able to get an idea so as to quote you.

Compile a list of the medications you take, if any, and dosage information. This list should include vitamin and mineral supplements and herbal products, as well as drugs or supplements you take only occasionally. Please tell me so that I may pass on to your surgeon, and the anesthesiologist for the procedure, about every drug – over the counter, prescription or illegal – you take. This is for your own safety. The surgeon and his or her office staff must keep all information about you confidential.

You will also be asked about any allergies you have or if you have ever had a bad reaction to any medications or anesthesia or to latex.

Make up a list of any other surgeries you have had or major illnesses and when you had them, since you will be asked about these and it can be hard to remember dates sometimes.

What happens at the consultation with my surgeon in Thailand?

At the consultation, you will meet with the surgeon who will perform your surgery. At the consultation, you may be given an informed consent form. This is a form that outlines all the possible risks of an abdominoplasty that you will have to read and sign if you decide to have the surgery. This piece of paper states that you have been fully informed about all the risks and that you completely understand them.





What happens at the Physical Examination?

The surgeon will examine you. You will be asked to remove your top and bra, and perhaps your panties, and get into an examination gown. A nurse is usually in the room during the examination. Your surgeon will examine your skin condition, type, thinness, and elasticity. He or she will also assess the amount of skin on your body/face to be removed and if muscle repair is necessary. He may pinch or tug on your skin gently to test your laxity. You may be asked to bend over slightly and relax your stomach muscles, he will also take photos. You may feel uncomfortable during this time, so prepare yourself for it.

After the consultation you will be taken by a representative for blood tests, heart tests and any other assessment that is required

How long after the consultation do I receive surgery?

I try to make your appointment the day following your arrival into Thailand, it is usually scheduled in the morning and then surgery is performed within 1-2 days after your pre ops

Will there be someone there at the hospital other than the staff and do they speak English?

Yes, we have a hospital representative for your comfort. Your surgeon will speak perfect English and most of the nursing staff speaks English as well. However you will find that some of the auxiliary staff do not speak very much English.

How do I get from/to hospital?

As part of the fee to hospital they provide a driver to pick you up at the airport and take you back, and will transport you to and back from every consultation and surgery in an air conditioned vehicle.

Will it be hot in Thailand?

Yes, hot and humid!

The rainy season lasts from July to October and is dominated by the southwest monsoon, during which time rainfall in most of Thailand is at its heaviest. However, like the "cool" season, the name "rainy season" is slightly misleading. While it certainly does rain during this season it's more likely to consist of flash-flood afternoon downpours than a continual drizzle for days. If you can bear the heat and humidity, the weather in Thailand is typically sunny throughout the rainy season, but when the rain comes, it's fast and it's furious.

I'm having a Tummy Tuck/ Breast lift and augmentation . What type of clothes can I wear after?

Many people say that because of the swelling, my clothes won't fit. Most patients prefer clothing that is comfortable and easy to get in and out of. Tops and sports bras that zip in the front are great. It will be uncomfortable for you to try to put a shirt or sweater over your head. Remember since its hot in Thailand anything light work very well as you will have some swelling. Right after surgery you may need clothes that can accommodate swelling. The good news is that after the breast implants your bra size will be larger, and after tummy tuck, you will have a smaller tummy to fit in pants once the swelling resolves.

The use of a post-surgical bra following breast surgery (augmentation, lift, reduction) is for both support and compression. Providing good support is more important than excessive compression. The 'support' will decrease post-operative pain and discomfort, reduce early stress on the skin closures, and help reduce dependent swelling within the breast. The 'compression' will help reduce swelling and enhance its resolution.

In fact, any type of garment that provides breast support and compression can be utilized. Immediately after the operation, surgeon place patients in a Surgilast tube top. This is a tubular elastic dressing that has a fishnet appearance. It is easy to place and avoids the need to worry about a properly fitting bra. Some patients continue this post-op and others change to a sports or other comfortable bra, the front fastening bras in Kmart work well. I emphasize to my patients that whatever they chose to wear should provide support.

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I recommend that patients wear post-op support and compression (every day, all day) for 6 weeks following surgery. During this time they prefer that they avoid an under wire bra. Patients can begin wearing an under wire bra after their swelling has subsided, the inframammary skin closures are healed and non-tender, and their implants have settled like they would expect.

What should I expect after Facelifts, Evelifts and Rhinoplasty?

Taking care of your skin after cosmetic surgeries is more complicated than after less invasive procedures because you need to treat your wounds, manage swelling, and keep up with everyday skin care for best results.

To minimize swelling, experts recommend regular use of ice or cold compresses, especially in the first three days after your surgery. Sleeping with you head elevated above your heart will also help avoid an increase in swelling overnight.

As for bruising, ask your surgeon whether you should take **Arnica montana**, an herbal supplement that may help minimize bruising or discolouration. I also am a big fan of **Bromelin** tablets (after surgery) which comes from the core of the pineapple. I also recommend eating pineapple leading up to and after surgery.

Even though your face will be sore after cosmetic surgery, it's important to continue to cleanse your skin regularly to help with healing and avoid build-up in your pores that might lead to breakouts. Try washing with mild astringent pads to cleanse sore areas without applying pressure. Then, be sure to apply a gentle, non-comedogenic moisturizer. Non-comedogenic moisturisers have a lighter feel than regular moisturisers, and many are oil-free, so they won't leave additional oil on your skin. Most labels will advertise if a are some of the best names in the field of hypoallergenic and non acnegenic products sold in NZ, **in fact**Cetaphil can be bought online shopping from Countdown supermarket!

For a face/neck lift immediately after you are in the recovery area after the surgery, your head and neck will be bandaged and probably in a compression type of garment to help reshape the new angle. The use of a compression garment (chin strap) for the first week or two following neck lift surgery helps reduce the bruising and swelling by applying pressure to the surgical area so that fluid and blood will not accumulate under the skin. Your surgeon will give you instructions on keeping your head and neck area completely still. If you need to turn to look at something, turn your entire body not just the neck. Not every surgeon will believe in using compression bandages, so make sure what your plastic surgeon's stance on this.

I have heard that I have to sleep sitting up after surgery, is this true? Breast augmentation:

Sleeping upright for the first few days after surgery will help decrease some of the swelling, but will not make the implants "drop" faster. You can sleep on your side after about a week or so but should avoid stomach sleeping for a few months. The implants will settle or "drop" naturally over time provided your surgeon created an adequate pocket or space for the implants. This whole process may take up to three months for the implants to soften and settle into their final natural position/shape. . Your plastic surgeon will give you very specific instructions on what bras to wear and exercises/activities to avoid. You should strictly follow these instructions.

Tummy Tuck: The best position to sit and even sleep in after a tummy tuck is the reclined position. One good position to sleep and sit after tummy tuck surgery is to recline in the "beach chair" position with one or two pillows behind your head and one or two pillows behind your knees. It will minimize the tension on your scar while your newly stretched skin relaxes over the days following surgery. Be sure to get up and walk several times a day and exercise your ankles and feet while reclining to prevent blood clots from developing in your legs.

Recovery from a tummy tuck surgery will take some time and, occasionally, it will not be pleasant. An abdominoplasty, especially a full abdominoplasty, is serious surgery. One thing you learn during the recovery is just how often you use your abdominal muscles on any given day!

The evening after your abdominoplasty surgery, you may be groggy from the anesthetic and/or oral medications. You actually probably won't remember much of the first day or two. You should take it easy.



Tips on Recovery from Tummy Tuck Surgery

When you wake up after tummy tuck surgery, your abdomen may be very swollen and it may be throbbing. Don't wait for pain to be unbearable before you take your pain medication. Take your pain medication on time because that stops the pain before it gets too bad. You will actually use less pain medication if you take it on time than if you wait for the pain to become severe. And pain interferes with healing. There is absolutely no reason to be tough and suffer through the pain.

As the days go on the swelling and pain will dissipate. You may have bruising, but this will go away as well. Make a mental note of this or you may be fall into a depression. Bruising and swelling are normal and only to be expected after most surgeries.

When you leave the hospital or surgical facility, you should receive a list of postoperative instructions and a general advice on the recovery from plastic surgery. This should tell you how often to change the dressings, whether you can shower or take a sponge bath, and what restrictions you have on your movement or activity. The list should also give you things to watch out for, such as an elevated temperature or bleeding from the incision and information on how to contact the surgeon.


The skin on your abdomen may be numb. This is normal. Abdominoplasty involves loosening the skin from its previous attachments and re-draping it. That action, along with the incisions, means that some nerves were cut. Sensation will usually come back gradually over the course of several months. Sometimes, the first thing you will feel in areas that were numb is itchiness or tingling. There is the possibility that sensation in the skin will not come back completely.

Sleep with your head and shoulders elevated for the first week to 14 days or however long your surgeon suggests. Use two or three good fluffy pillows to keep your head up or perhaps a wedge-shaped pillow.

You will be laying down a lot because you will be sore and will have problems standing upright for a week. Sitting may be more comfortable, but still might be a bit much for you. Sleeping may not be a problem, since some pain medications can make you sleepy. The energy that your body will use in healing can also make you feel sleepy, too. Sleeping is actually good for you while you heal.

Getting up and down from a sitting position or in and out of bed will be difficult and will hurt. One trick I learned to get out of bed was to first roll on my side close to the edge of the bed. Then I would let my legs drop over the side of the bed at the same time I pushed my upper body upright with the arm that was underneath me. This way I spared my abdominal muscles a bit of strain. Remember, everything will continue to get easier as the days pass. Full recovery after tummy tuck could be several weeks.

You will have a follow-up visit with your surgeon about 3 or 4 days after your tummy tuck surgery. He or she will check your drains, examine your incision, and generally check to see how you are doing. Your sutures may be removed 5 to 10 days after surgery, but may be left in for 2 weeks or more. Parts of your incision may heal faster than other parts, so your surgeon may take some sutures out and leaves others in a little longer. While the incision is still open, do not smoke or use nicotine patches or gums. These interfere with healing. Better yet, quit smoking.



The Importance of Post Operative Appointments

Once you have had the surgery it is like being at the half way mark in a long distance race. The recovery part of this procedure takes an enormous amount of patience and fortitude, as the healing process will be changing daily. All post operative appointments are included with your final price that you paid your surgeon. Your surgeon will lay out in the post operative instructions, what medication to take and when, the appointments and time you are required to come into the hospital so that he can check your overall status with healing.

Do I see the surgeon again for a check up?

Your First Post Operative appointment - most plastic surgeons will want to see you after 24 hours in the ward.

This is your first post operative appointment, and it is to gauge how you are doing and to assess your progress since the procedure.

The Second Post Operative appointment is usually on discharge day, he will come to the ward

Week 2: You will still have sutures in your incisions, so your surgeon might take this appointment to remove them. Most of the time sutures are removed anywhere from 5 - 7 days post op. Your plastic surgeon will check the incision for any unnecessary drainage, and if you have drains you might have these removed at this time.

The Third Post Operative appointment is usually at the end of the second week.

Do I have to wear support garments?

Yes you must wear abdominal support garments especially for tummy tuck or breast augmentation or reduction! Your doctor may advise you to wear a support garment around your abdomen. This may be in the form of a wide binder that goes around your abdomen or a girdle-like garment that pulls on or zips up the side. Either will compress your abdomen a bit and help in healing and controlling the swelling. You may even wake up after the surgery with an abdominal binder already on.

You might want to have two of the binders (check out trade me) or surgical abdominal support garments on hand while you heal, so that you can wear one while you wash the other.

Tummy Tuck Recovery Tips from Abdominoplasty Patients

- 1. Buy two pairs off cotton panties three sizes bigger than you usually get. Nice big old granny panties, not bikinis. A tight elastic band around your sore abdomen is not comfy! If the seams bother you, wear the panties inside out. Wash them first to get out the chemicals and soften them.
- 2. If the bulbs of the drain pokes you, put a sanitary napkin or a gauze square dressing between the bulb and the skin (whilst you are laying bed). The drain is removed on the day of your discharge from the hospital.
- 3. Ask your plastic surgeon if you can put Bacitracin, Neosporin or another antibiotic ointment on the incision. I did. I found it very soothing, and have healed beautifully. However, some surgeons do not want you to touch the incision any more than is absolutely necessary. Follow your surgeon's instructions.
- 4. If you have extra pillows, put some under your bottom sheet to make a nice soft nest to sleep on. You'll probably be sleeping on your back at first. It can help a lot if you put one or two pillows under your knees. That can help prevent some stretching on your new abdomen.
- 5. Take your pain medications! That is what they're for. And don't forget that it gets better every day!

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Will I get Tummy Tuck Scars?

Abdominoplasty is not scar-free surgery. Remember that your abdominoplasty scars will get worse before they get better. Your incision will heal, but scars go through a series of changes before they are completely healed and that can take months. Scars will look their worst at about 3 months after your abdominoplasty surgery. They tend to get very red and thick and raised. Sometimes, if you are cold, they turn a horrible gray-purple. It may take up to a year for your tummy tuck scars to flatten and fade. Most doctors take great care in placing the incisions well below the bikini lines so that they remain hidden, even when you're at the beach! Remember to protect your fresh tummy tuck scars from the sun exposure.

Ask your surgeon about silicone sheeting or other scar minimizing products. These sheets have been shown to help prevent the formation of keloids on your scars and to help flatten old scars, too. Keloids are overgrowths of scar tissue that can form in some wounds. Some people, especially people with medium to dark skin) are prone to developing keloids.

The I have found are CICA-CARE silicone gel sheets, not cheap but worth it!

Silicone sheeting is to be used only after your wounds have closed.

Will I suffer with depression after Surgery?

Many patients, including me, experience periods of sadness or anxiety as they recover from cosmetic surgery. We begin to second guess ourselves and wonder if we ever should have had the surgery in the first place. We begin to think we are "ugly" and that the bruising and swelling will never go away. If you are feeling like that, you are not alone. In fact, you're quite normal!

How do I have to sleep after a Face/neck lift?

Sleeping in a reclining chair is the best position with your chin up by using a U shaped airplane pillow works best in my practice. I usually suggest that my clients sleep that way for the 10 days however the amount of time to stay elevated after any head and neck surgery is dependent on the amount of bruising and swelling you may have. The main reason to stay elevated is to ensure rapid resolution of your swelling and bruising.

Handy Hint:

I took with me 2 x inflatable children's swimming rings, (one for spare in case the first one popped!) I would put it in the hotel bed, cover it with a towel and sit on it; this alleviated any pressure on my tailbone and kept me from slipping down in the bed at night. I also had a made a "V" shaped cushion that extended from the top of my spine to my hips, I had it made from quite dense foam and even used it on the plane journey there and back!

When can I get in the shower?

The nurse will shower you and wash your hair on your day that you are discharged. Ask your surgeon when you will be allowed to shower yourself. You will probably be instructed not to take a bath and personally I would use a hand held shower so as not to get stitches wet since sitting in standing water before your incision heals is pretty much asking for an infection! (You will not be able to go swimming until the incision heals, too.) Some surgeons allow you to shower 2 to 3 days after your cosmetic surgery, while others only allow sponge baths until a week afterwards. If you are allowed to shower, you may be asked to wear your support garments, or shower under just a light trickle of water, or with your back to the shower spray. Ask your surgeon for specific showering instructions. Remember, you may feel a bit dizzy or unsteady on your feet due to medications, so be careful in the shower.



When can I go back to work?

You will probably be "out of commission" for at least 2 weeks after your surgery. Your doctor will tell you when you can return to work and to regular activities. However, the more extensive your surgery, the longer the time off from work and other activities will be. Recovery time from surgery varies from person to person. You may need up 6 weeks off for proper healing if you had for example a very extensive abdominoplasty and other surgery. Another factor is what kind of work you do. If you sit at a desk all day you can probably return to your job sooner than if you are a gym teacher or a courier.

You should not resume exercising until your surgeon says you can. Usually this is at least 3 weeks or more after your abdominoplasty surgery, depending on the extent of your surgery. You may also be able to do some exercises or sports before you are allowed to do others. Listen to your body and don't push yourself. Actually, you probably will not think of exercising for at least a few weeks.

Can I walk around after surgery?

You will be encouraged to do a bit of walking every day in the first week and more as the weeks pass. Do it. Walking around helps prevent blood clot formation and eases swelling.

Pain medications (among other drugs) can cause constipation and other digestive problems and can back everything up. You may feel bloated and sometimes even have some intestinal cramps.

Drink plenty of water! This is a big help in keeping you regular and in helping with bloating and other distress. I cannot stress this enough. Some surgeons suggest a mild stool softener a high-fibre cereal after you are finished with your medications. This helps with getting your digestive tract in working order again and helps flush out residual medications and whatnot from the "pipes."

What about Make-up After Cosmetic Surgery?

If your skin is intact and you have no open wounds, you can resume using makeup just a few days after your procedure. After deep chemical peels or ablative laser procedures, however, it's essential to wait until your epidermis (the top layer of your skin) has fully reformed.

When you do get the go-ahead to use makeup, remember the following tips:

- Go for mineral. Many makeup manufacturers now make mineral-based lines that are gentler on your skin and provide excellent coverage.
- Combat red with green. If you have red skin or purple bruising after cosmetic surgery, a green base will help balance out those colours and give you a more natural-looking skin tone. Top this base with a powder about one shade darker than you usually wear for best results.

I have told you get a bit emotional after surgery, is this true?

I actually got a bit "weepy" after a few days, apparently this is due to the anaesthetic in the system and is quite normal and only lasted a day or so, much like the "baby blues".

Feelings of sadness after plastic surgery are normal. If you are feeling sad or depressed after surgery, print out this list and read it to yourself. Read it aloud if necessary. What you are feeling is a normal part of healing and recovering from your surgery.

I realise that feelings of sadness do not happen to all people, but that it may happen to me. I know I need to be patient and think positively. Positive thinking promotes better healing and better relaxation. I know I need to wait out my healing period before I pass judgment on how I look. I know I need to follow my surgeon's instructions to increase my chances of having a great result. I know that stress and anxiety can only make matters worse and I will try my best to not let it affect me.



The night before you will need to:

- Take a shower
- Remove all metal piercings.
- Remove nail vanish (off of at least one finger nail)

Morning Of Surgery

• DO NOT EAT OR DRINK anything (not even water) after midnight prior to surgery.

You may brush your teeth, but do not swallow any water. Do not chew gum, candy, mints, or drink coffee the morning of your surgery. Do not sneak anything as this may endanger you or result in cancellation or delay of your procedure.

- Leave all jewelry and valuables securely at the hotel in the room safe.
- Do not wear moisturisers, fragrance, and makeup the day of your surgery.
- Wear loose clothing that is easy to take off and on. Button up shirts/zip up sweatshirts work well.
- Remove nail varnish

If you smoke, refrain from cigarettes at least two weeks prior to and until completely healed or at least six weeks after surgery. The health of your skin and the ability of your wounds to heal are greatly impaired by the effects of smoking.

Bruise easily?

Before treatment there are several items to stay away from to help minimize bruising. Avoid aspirin, nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory medications such as ibuprofen, St. John's Wort or high doses of vitamin E supplements. These agents may increase bruising and bleeding at the injection site.

How to minimize bruising after procedures

You have decided to have a cosmetic facial procedure, and whether it is an eye lift or a nose job, one of the common side effects to any facial surgery is bruising. While this is inevitable, there are things to do before and after your surgical procedure that will help to minimize your bruising and how long it lasts. With the addition of a few herbal and vitamin supplements as well as proper aftercare, your bruising can be reduced and your healing process made easier.

Things You'll Need:


- Arnica Montana supplements
- Vitamin C supplements
- Bromelain supplements (this is awesome for healing)
- Cold compress/ THE HOSPTIAL WILL GIVE YOU ONE, ASK THE HOTEL TO PUT IN THEIR FREEZER

Try these suggestions:


- Do not take aspirin, ibuprofen or vitamin E supplements for at least two weeks prior to your facial procedure. These medications act as a blood thinner and can increase your risk of bruising.
- Take 1,000 milligrams of vitamin C starting three days prior to surgery and for seven days after your facial procedure. Vitamin C aids in immunity and healing.
- Take three or four Arnica Montana supplement pellets under your tongue beginning three days prior to your facial surgery, recommends SurgicalArt.net. Take these four times a day and continue taking them for five days after the procedure. This is a homeopathic herb designed to reduce bruising.
- Take 1,000 milligrams of Bromelain supplements for the five days following surgery, This is a homeopathic medication designed to minimize facial bruising.
- Apply a cold compress to the facial bruising area every 20 minutes for 2 to 3 days after your procedure.
- Sleep with your head elevated at a 45-degree angle. This helps reduce swelling and bruising of the facial area.



The primary governing body for **dentists in Thailand** is the Thai Dental Council (TDC). Dentists are automatically granted a licence from the TDC upon graduation. If you've lost one or more teeth, your dentist may suggest you get dental implants as a treatment option. Dental implants are artificial structures that replace your tooth roots. A dental surgeon puts the implant into your jawbone, and it provides a strong foundation for an artificial tooth called a crown. The crown is custom made to match the colour of the rest of your teeth and custom-made to fit your mouth. It will function, feel, and look like your natural teeth.

It's important to keep in mind that the process of getting dental implants is time-consuming. It usually requires more than one visit to the dentist. The whole process may take, a couple of weeks or several months, depending on your specific oral condition, requirement, and the type of implant you want. Therefore, you'll need to fly to Thailand at least twice during the process. Although the process is time-consuming, dental implants are considered the best teeth replacement treatment since they're stronger, last longer, and fit better than dentures and bridges.



The cost of comparable accommodation in Pattaya is generally less expensive than Phuket and Samui, which makes it excellent value for money. Furthermore, it features excellent restaurants, good entertainment, and countless sightseeing activities. The bottom line is that nobody can possibly be bored in Pattaya.

Know This First:

- 1. If you're planning to spend money overseas, using a travel money card, credit card or bank-issued debit card have been the most popular methods.
- 2. With every transaction using these cards, cardholders have been hit with foreign currency conversion fees, ATM withdrawal fees and/or a bunch of other fees.
- 3. The Wise debit card has shaken things up by offering never-seen-before features rock bottom overseas currency conversion fees, free ATM withdrawals, an app to track and manage your money, and even foreign bank account setup.

Summary of the Wise Debit Card?

- The Wise debit card is easy to sign up to and packed with features. We see it as very similar to a travel money card, but cheaper in seemingly every sense.
- There is a one-off \$14 charge to issue the Wise debit card this covers
 postage and account setup. After you pay the \$14, there is no further
 ongoing charge (i.e. when the card renews). Despite the upfront fee, we

- Living in New Zealand and travelling often to Thailand? Thai baht and multi-currency card lets you convert your local currency to spend when travelling to Thailand. This multi-currency card will give you the best rate for spending in Thai baht and 50+ other currencies.
